Teachers and parents can access the resources available on the website, such as materials for role playing, as well as contests and games, to bring out values of compassion and empathy. Students can also find Sharity songs and lyrics to sing along, as well as watch Sharity animation episodes to know what he and his friends are up to.
- 5. Two of these animation episodes are already available on the website. We will be screening one of the episodes later, so keep your eyes peeled! The animation episodes will address issues relevant to girls like you, such as cyber bullying, working as a team, and respecting and accepting friends with disabilities. Through these shared adventures, Sharity & Friends hope to encourage and motivate all of you to step up and make a difference in the way you interact with those around you.
- 6. Today's launch is also held in conjunction with MGS's 130<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations. MGS seeks to empower their students to express gratitude and acts of service and kindness in their everyday lives. I see that the MGS girls have also stepped up to help out with emceeing, facilitating of experiential activities and hosting of your friends with different abilities today.
- 7. I am heartened to know that MGS has encouraged its students to help the less fortunate through various initiatives, such as providing

its school facilities for children with disabilities from AWWA to conduct physiotherapy sessions, and donating proceeds from their yearly musical showcase ticket sales to Rainbow Centre. I hope that you can forge lasting friendships with your peers from AWWA and Rainbow Centre, care for and learn alongside one another, much like Sharity and his friends.

- 8. If we care deeply for those around us and share what we have freely, we will be able to make a positive impact on the lives of the less fortunate and help shape a more caring and inclusive society.
