I am also specially warmed by the many happy faces of our children on this special day, jointly organised by Community Chest and Resorts World Sentosa (RWS), for children with different abilities in celebration of Children's Day on 9 October 2015
- Today is our first-ever Sharity Day, which is part of Community Chest's efforts to nurture our young generation telling them that they, too, can make a difference in the lives of people around us. This new signature event, under the Care & Share Movement for SG50, is one that creates a meaningful opportunity for students both from mainstream and special education schools to interact and have fun together.

- Thank you RWS, for being one of the fore-runners in heeding the call for sustained giving, which we advocate through the Care & Share Movement. Those of you who were students in the 1980s would also remember him fondly. Among us are the Primary 3 students, who have already received a twinkling Sharity collar pin after performing good deeds at home, in school and in the community. You will soon be seeing Sharity a lot more often in schools, so do join him on the journey of caring for and sharing with those in need.
